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AN INTERVIEW WITH CHIEKO FUJIWARA



SENSEI HER MOTHER

A nonagenarian, she is now 94 years old. She is Chieko Fujiwara Sama - Mother of our beloved Nigam Sensei. She has come to visit her daughter in Kolkata. She first came here in1980 when her Q You have come to India ---Kolkata almost nine grandchild was born. We had an informal chat with or ten times ---what is your impression about her at Sensei `s flat. Her conviviality charmed us. ,Excerpts from the interview:

Q You were born in Kobe, a part of Osaka - you started your primary schooling there..

A Yes after completing primary School I entered difference. the Jogakkou----girls' school -after that I went to a But regarding maintaining of roads, I think here Senmongakkou ---a commerce school

Q You did not go to a college or university

A Then my father passed away and my mother Q Your hobby wanted me to work and earn. So I started to learn A Singing, reading Chinese poems Book -Keeping in that commerce college

O After completing the training you started to A Omoide? work in a private company

A Yes, during those days it was very rare for women to go out for a job ---but I had to do due to the demise of my father, After completion of the course I was recommended by the school and I got this time was connected with this service. On job in a good company,

Q Sugoi ne! There you worked for 5 years in book-keeping. You were very good in using the Soroban

A Yes those days there was no type machine or computer I had to do the book-keeping manually,

Q After 5 years you left the job

A Actually then I got married – I met my husband in that company --- we both worked in the same company, But in those days, according to Company rules, a husband and wife could not work in the same company So I had to leave the job and became a full-fledged housewife.

Q We have heard that you could read Chinese poem (Kanshi) very well. Do you still remember all those?

Actually in Japan everybody had to learn Α Chinese poem in school.

Q You performed on Chinese poem on stage in group - chorus - you also used to learn Japanese folk songs

A Yes – I used to learn Japanese folk songs –*Min* yo ----I had also performed on the stage. I also used to play Koto --- and performed on the stage.

Q Can you still sing Japanese songs?

A I learnt a lot - but now I cannot remember - I can sing just a little bit.

Indians or people of Kolkata?

Actually in Kobe --there were so many Α foreigners - Indians also lived there ----so I know Indians very well. When I see them I feel no

they are maintained very poorly and economically Japan 's lifestyle is much higher – better than India

Q Any memorable experience

During the 2nd World War every Japanese had to serve the country by doing some voluntary service. I had to serve also. I had to go to a factory for Accounting work in a factory. Another incident in account of this service we had no time to attend my commerce school and due to this that school also could not conduct regular classes. But we were given certificates just after appearing in a sort of token exam based on questions of whatever little syllabus was completed.



Sightseeing in Kolkata was on the 18th and since the Japan side had expressed their desire to see some British architecture and the historical places here, we decided to take a tour around the heritage buildings near the GPO, an important landmark in Kolkata. On the 19th - the last day, NKKS hosted the farewell party followed by a small birthday celebration for one of the Japan side members.

The IJSC is a platform that builds a cultural as well as a bond of friendship which gradually grows with time. Therefore, I hope more people get to experience the thrill of the IJSC because I believe it has a lot to offer



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
